Platanos College has this year received national recognition from The Schools, Students and Teachers Network (SSAT), for the value it adds to pupils' achievement at GCSE.

The school has qualified for a second consecutive year, the SSAT Educational Outcomes Award by being in the top 10% of schools nationally for progress made by pupils between their key stage 2 results at primary school and their GCSE results at age 16.

Platanos College has introduced new scholarships and bursaries from September 2016.

I think these trips are really valuable and would like to attend more."



Stimulating STEM Day




