## **Jack Petchey Speak Out Lambeth Champions**

At Platanos College we place an immense value on debating and public speaking as we believe this provides our most able pupils with intellectual stimulation outside of the classroom that facilitates the development of higher order thinking skills.

Last term, our Year 10 pupils attended the *Jack Petchey Public Speaking"Speak Out"* Workshop, an annual programme run by the school to support our Year 10 pupils in achieving the top A/A\* GCSE grades in English.

**Shana Kay Harwood** and **Patrick Ballesteros**, the winners of our Year 10 "*Speak Out*" school competition, were invited to take part in the *Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge Lambeth Final* last term.

The final consisted of eight Lambeth schools, including St Martin in the Fields, Dunraven and La Retraite. As expected, the competition was fierce and the standard of speeches this year was

extremely high. However, our first speaker **Shana Kay** fought off the stiff competition and impressed the judges by delivering an inspirational speech against the death penalty, making her one of the favourites to win the competition. Unfortunately, she was penalised for speaking beyond the strict three minute time limit.

Our second speaker **Patrick Ballesteros**, however, also delivered a truly outstanding speech entitled "*The Influence of the Media*". Patrick's articulate, eloquent delivery and his logical, persuasive arguments highly

## **Educational Visit to the Tate Britain**

On Friday 19<sup>th</sup> April 2013, our pupils visited the Tate Britain as part of their GCSE Art. They were able to see a number of fascinating artworks from the new Tate Britain collection from the 1800s to the present. Many pupils were taken by the work of John Brett, 'The British Channel seen from the Dorsetshire Cliffs' (1871), depicting an ocean landscape with rays of sunshine reflecting off the water. Pupils recorded sounds heard in the gallery, the meanings of artworks, and the artists that inspired them and wrote down suggestions for media they would like to try.

Pupils will use this experience and the drawings from this trip to inspire ideas for their exam preparation where they will create an exhibition piece under exam conditions. This year's exam is

based around the theme 'Force', with many pupils exploring the forces of nature or force created by celebrity culture.
