On the 26th February 2018, Isaac Dogboe gave an impromptu visit and talk to Mr.Klassen's Year 7 PE class.

Isaac is an ex-student who completed Year 11 and went on to represent Ghana in the 2012 olympics and won the interim WBO bantamweight boxing belt.

This made him the number one contender and mandatory challenger for the WBO word title, which took place on Saturday 14th April and was broadcast on ESPN and Box Nation TV.

It was a dramatic and scintillating fight which Isaac won with a technical knockout in the 11th round. Isaac is now the WBO World Bantamweight Champion and vows to return to Platanos College to share his experiences with our current pupils.

Sapphire was also successful in achieving first place in the Year 7 girls' 4x100m relay where she teamed up with Leatiyah Adeyemi, Tiara Marriott and Shani Johnson.

Janet Beia won silver in the Year 10 200m finals against tough competition. The Year 9 team was successful in achieving second place in the 4x100m relay and the Year 10 team achieved third place in their 4x100m relay. Both Sapphire and Janet have been selected to represent the Lambeth Schools Team at the London Schools Athletics Championships in June.





YEAR 9 BOYS CROWNED SOUTH LONDON FOOTBALL CHAMPIONS

The Year 9 team competed in the South London School League final at Cobham - the training ground of Chelsea Football Club. The team were defending champions and were up against the same opponents as last year. The boys continued to play but a defensive error occurred, and Harris were awarded a penalty. The Harris striker ruthlessly dispatched the penalty to make it 3-1 to Harris. With only 11 minutes to play, the boys dug deep and showed great determination, Abdoulaye scored to make it 3-2 after a wonderful save from David Mata's volley. The boys did not stop there; Kalani was then able to make a beautiful run in between the Harris centre backs and was able to score to make it 3-3. The boys were on a roll and were determined to finish off the match within 90



minutes. Wesley incredibly then shot at goal with the outside of his boot to curl the ball into the net to make it four. The score finished 4-3 to Platanos College and it was a scene of euphoria from the team at the end - an unbelievable comeback.

Ade Adebayo (2012 – 2017)

Ade graduated from Platanos College in 2017 and has since gone to study at Barking Abbey (No. 1 elite basketball academy in the country). Ade has also most recently been ranked the No. 1 player in the country for his respective age group. Ade intends to gain a full basketball scholarship in America once he has finished his studies at Barking Abbey.



Ola Ayodele (2007 – 2012)

Ola graduated from Platanos in 2012 where he then eventually went to study in America on a full basketball scholarship at Laramie Community College. Ola graduated from Laramie in 2018 and intends to stay in America to attend a university whilst competing at basketball at the universities' highest level.



Rayell Eytle Rock (2010 – 2015)

Rayell graduated from Platanos in 2014 where he then went to attend Barking Abbey College for a further 2 years.
Barking Abbey is the leading college in the country for elite basketball players. Rayell was Barking's key player during his time there, whilst also representing and captaining England (U16 & U18) and Great Britain's U20 team at international tournaments. Rayell is now on a full basketball scholarship at Peddie College in America.



Denilson Caschilli (2015 – 2017)

Denilson had been attending the basketball academy at Platanos since he was in Year 6, before finally attending the school in 2015. As a result of Denilson's hardwork, dedication and skill level in basketball, Denilson was offered a place at Dinamo Sassirio, which is a professional Basketball Academy in Italy. Dinamo's feedback of Denilson is that they love Denilson's attitude and have very high hopes for Denilson of joining their professional team once he is old enough.

Jules was our first pupil at Platanos
College to go on to play professional
basketball. Attending Platanos College in

opportunity to travel the world, living in
countries such as Spain, Germany,

Patrick graduated from Platanos College in 2015 where he went onto to study in Leicester at Charnwood College whilst playing basketball at the highest college level within England. During this time, Patrick also represented and helped the Irish national team qualify for their first ever 2017 European championships. Patrick's intention is to attend college to play basketball on a scholarship after completing his final year at Charnwood College.
