They are expected to establish and maintain the highest standards of behaviour, attitude and appearance at all times and be positive role models for other pupils.

Year 10 Work Experience

The work experience programme is an integral part of the Year 10 curriculum and provides an opportunity for our pupils to gain an invaluable insight into the 'world of work'. This helps all pupils to prepare for the responsibilities and opportunities of adult life. In addition, it also enhances employability skills and allows our pupils to acquire a better understanding of the labour market.

Although we have a small selection of work experience placements we can offer, our pupils are encouraged and invited to find their

own placement with assistance from their parents/carers. To assist with the process, we intend on offering an online help guide via our website in the spring term.

All placements are required to complete a work experience placement form which must be returned to the main office. Work experience will commence on the 9th July 2019 to 23rd July 2019.

Please be aware that some types of work experience placements are extremely difficult to secure due to confidentiality issues, workplace age restrictions or risk or work type. These may include placements in fields such as: Medicine, Law, Finance, Media and Performing Arts. Year 10 pupils targeting careers in these fields should select placements linked to these areas rather than directly within them.

It is also worth noting that there is a lot of local competition for work experience placements, as many of the local schools have the same work experience period. Therefore, applying as soon as possible gives your child the best chance of getting the placement they most desire.

Lastly, the application to secure a placement may also vary. Some employers like a formal application email with a CV attached or a written application, others may prefer a telephone call or a drop-in visit (especially customer focused areas such as Catering, Retail, Hair and Beauty, whereby the employer wants to assess the applicant's personal attributes).

Whilst many well-known large businesses operate their own work experience programmes, pupils are encouraged to send out speculative letters and emails to businesses they wish to approach. This will demonstrate initiative and self-motivation; two qualities which employers greatly value.

We hope that you will support the school in helping your son/daughter with this process.

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Careers Advice

Platanos College along with 16 other Lambeth schools is part of the 'Quality in Careers Standard'. The Quality in Careers Standard is the national quality award for careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) in schools, colleges and work-based learning.

The 'Quality in Careers Standard' is about improving our pupils' awareness of opportunities, raising their aspirations and working with them to ensure they achieve their full potential.

As part of our ongoing commitment to provide impartial, independent careers education, information, advice and guidance to all of our pupils, our Year 11 pupils are currently attending a one-to-one careers interview, which is delivered by Ms Ogun, our school's Careers Advisor. Interviews are carried out throughout the school day. If parents/carers wish to accompany their child, a meeting can be arranged to meet with Ms Ogun, out of school hours. BT Skills for Work Boot Camp

On Friday 12th October 2018, a cohort of 34 Year 10 pupils was given the opportunity to visit the British Telecom main office in St. Pauls, to take part in their 'Skills for Work Boot Camp'.

Led by BT's in-house training team and supported and mentored by a variety of BT volunteers from different roles, pupils had the opportunity to gain invaluable knowledge and experience from current professionals.

The aim of the visit was to provide pupils with a better understanding of the current labour

market, by challenging conventional thinking and raise aspirations, and take home practical skills to apply to their career path.

They focused on how to improve their employability skills and to consider their first steps into the world of work. Pupils thought about how to choose a career path and where to get advice to inform their decision making. They investigated what values, interests and skills they have and created a profile to help sell themselves in the world of work. They looked at how online profiles and social media sites can affect their career opportunities with perspective employers, and how to present themselves in a CV. They also discussed how to prepare for an interview (looking at body language, dress code and the do's and don'ts), including confidence building techniques.

In the final activity the pupils worked together to create and deliver presentations for a new product of their design.

The facilitators fedback that they were very impressed with the confidence of our pupils and overall, the experience of the BT 'Skills for Work Boot Camp' was a valuable experience for all the pupils who attended, who were really engaged in the process. Equally, we would like to thank the staff from BT who gave up their time to work with our pupils.

Attendance and Punctuality

At Platanos College, we continue to feel strongly about the importance of maintaining excellent attendance and punctuality to ensure outstanding results.

May we take this opportunity to remind all parents and carers that there is an expectation that your child should be in school every day apart from serious illness. Even 95% attendance equates to a child missing half a day of school every two weeks, which in Key Stage 4 is a significant amount of learning time lost. Therefore every Key Stage

4 pupil should aim for 100% attendance, as this will ensure we maximise all learning opportunities, especially bearing in mind the difficulties and challenges of the new GCSE 9-1 system.

Whilst we accept that there are times when absence from school cannot be avoided, these occasions must be kept to a bare minimum. We will not authorise holidays during term time and where attendance drops below an acceptable threshold, parents and carers will be issued a Fixed Penalty Notice (FPN) and may be asked to attend court to explain their child's absences as dictated by regulations that the school has to follow.

We make no apologies for this approach; regular attendance is one of the significant factors in ensuring that children make progress at school and it is our duty to safeguard our pupils' learning.

Lastly, due to an increase in unexplained absences, we now require <u>medical evidence</u> for all short-term absences.

The school will no longer sanction illness/absences without medical evidence. Where possible, a doctor's certificate, medical prescription or prescribed medication must be produced at the school office; this will be deemed as acceptable evidence. It is vital that parents/carers continue to contact the school on every day of any absence in line with the school's safeguarding policy.

Please support your child by ensuring that they attend school every day. We sincerely thank you in advance for your support.

Behaviour Expectations

Platanos College would like to congratulate the vast majority of our pupils for continuing to have an excellent attitude towards their learning and continually demonstrating outstanding behaviour. These pupils continue to be fantastic ambassadors for our school

and all of our staff are very proud of their achievements.

Given the changes in the new GCSEs, we continue to stretch and challenge all pupils. The examinations being significantly harder means that poor behaviour will not enable pupils to meet the demands of the new changes. It is therefore imperative that we reiterate our expectations with regard to behaviour.

We expect all of our pupils to behave in a way that contributes to excellent learning and outstanding lessons. For that reason please continue to support the School's Discipline and Behaviour Policy and remind your child of the school's expectations and the need to demonstrate good behaviour in school and around the local community.

Intervention / Revision Sessions

We were very pleased to see so many Year 11 pupils attending their intervention sessions over the half term break. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff involved and the parents and carers for their ongoing support in encouraging their child to attend.

The aim of these targeted intervention sessions is to enable our pupils to have access to staff for more personalised support, as well as encouraging them to develop their independence in preparing for their exams at the end of Year 11.

The expectation is that all Year 11 pupils must attend all intervention sessions whether that be after school or during the holiday periods leading up to their final exams. We appreciate that the term breaks are important both in terms of families spending time together and pupils having a much-needed and well-deserved break; however, we cannot stress the importance of attending these intervention sessions which are invaluable so please continue to encourage your child to attend.
