

Year 11 Parent fact sheet:

What I need to know, to help my Year 11 child post 16.



What options are available have after GCSEs?

Is education compulsory after GCSEs (age 16+)?

Under the present law, the school leaving age from September 2015 raised to 18.

Pupils must then do one of the following until you are 18:

- stay in full-time education, for example at a college or 6th form (A levels, NVQs, BTECs, TechBacs and International Baccalaureate (IB))
- start an apprenticeship
- start a traineeship

What can I do to support my child?

- Listen to your child
- Help research further education options
- Help complete application forms
- Encourage applying for a minimum of 3 Sixth forms/colleges by January 2018
- ♦ Accompany your child to open days and interviews
- ♦ Give constant positive encouragement at all times

Will there be any financial help?

There is a 16-19 Bursary Fund to help young people most in need entering education or training. Some schools, colleges and training providers will also have some extra funding. For more information www.gov.uk/1619-bursary-fund
