

## **Anne Frank Exhibition 2014**

The Anne Frank Exhibition at Platanos College returned this year in February. The exhibition took place from the 3<sup>rd</sup> February to the 13<sup>th</sup> February at the college due to its success in previous years.

The exhibition draws on the power of Anne Frank's diary to challenge prejudice and encourage people to embrace positive attitudes, responsibility and respect for others.
