

Anti-Bullying Ambassadors

Anti-Bullying Ambassadors are returning this year as part of our extensive Leadership Programme. Pupils are chosen each year to be champions of the Anti-Bullying agenda running at Platanos College. Our Anti-Bullying Ambassadors are currently undertaking a 3 week training session with an external educator will who speak about different types of bullying and how to deal with any bullying incidences that may occur in school. The Ambassadors will also look further into Cyber bullying and they will look at case studies and do group work.

Previous Anti-Bullying Ambassadors will help assist with these sessions acting as a support for the new Ambassadors. Pupils will also look at what it means to be an Anti-Bullying Ambassador and what their roles and responsibilities will be around the school.

Below is a break down of what the Anti-Bullying Ambassadors did during the last school year:

September 2016

- Assemblies were delivered about bullying and for the recruitment of an Anti-Bullying Ambassadors. Pupils from Year 7 to Year 10 were selected to be Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.
- Anti-Bullying Ambassadors were given red badges saying Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and were given blue books where they report any incidences.

November 2016- Anti-Bullying week

January - February 2017

- Additional Anti-Bullying assemblies led by Ms Bartley.

- Ambassadors are continually being vigilant, recording and reporting incidences of bullying.
- Ambassadors started a monthly anti-bullying forum which is like a type of restorative
 justice session where Anti-Bullying Ambassadors and pupils who have had friendship
 issues come and discuss and work out the problems with the influence and support of the
 Anti-Bullying Ambassadors.

March 2017

- The Anti-Bullying Ambassadors lead a seminar session where they will be looked at Cyber

 Bullying. The session took place during the Year 7, Year 8 and Year 9 PSHRE lesson.
- More Anti-Bullying Ambassador led assemblies took place.
