Platanos pupils unveil the Millicent Fawcett statue at Parliament Square

Platanos College pupils were invited to a historical occasion yesterday at Parliament Square, Westminster.

Our pupils took part in the unveiling of the statue of suffragist Dame Millicent Fawcett at Parliament Square as part of the #BehindEveryGreatCity campaign promoting gender equality and celebrating 100 years since the 1918 Representation of the People Act gave some women the right to vote.

Alongside the Prime Minister, Theresa May, and the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan, **our Year 10 pupil, Aminah Precious N'Gbale**, was on stage to pull the cord to unveil the first female statue.

As part of the campaign and equality workshops, Platanos College pupils learned about the history of the campaign for women's suffrage, gender equality and the current challenges of the modern era.


