Year 7 pupils at Seussical the Musical

On Tuesday 27th November, some of our Year 7 pupils went on a theatre trip to watch *Seussical the Musical*. The storyline covered issues of bullying, self-empowerment and empathy in a very accessible way, addressing some of the social, moral, spiritual and culture (SMSC) aspects of development.

The fantastical world of Dr. Seuss bursts onto the stage in this larger-than-life musical extravaganza brimming with fun and excitement for "thinkers" of all ages. You'll join the mischievous Cat in the Hat, Horton the Elephant, Gertrude McFuzz, and a host of other much-loved characters on a magical, madcap adventure from the Jungle of Nool, to the Circus McGurkus, to the tiniest planet in the sky, Whoville.

Set to an electric score and co-conceived by Monty Python's Eric Idle, this raucous and ultimately touching story by Tony Award winners Lynn Ahrens & Stephen Flaherty is a feel-good musical bonanza which dares us to think big and reminds us of the power of loyalty, family, and acceptance. The trip allowed pupils to experience theatre, some for their first time, in a really creative production with particular appeal through lots of focus on sensory experiences and audience interaction. After the show, cast members stayed back to meet the pupils.
