

- Be appreciative of the unusual circumstances as this could possibly be the new norm.
- Keeping in-touch with the department (for a sense of

- sanity) as it is the norm to spend 45 hours per week with the team.
- Try to do something I would not usually do during a normal working day.

By applying these strategies I have been successful in maintaining rationality, balance and a sound mind. Well that's the account provided by my family.

Keeping the Platanos spirit alive? Being ever-present for the pupils in trying to maintain 'normality' during indifferent circumstances.

Studies over the years have suggested that it takes two weeks to formulate a habit, I think I have adjusted to this swimmingly.
