We are very pleased at the attitudes displayed by Year 11, they are engaging proactively in lessons, they are accessing online learning and they are actively engaged in Independent learning.

Online Intervention Sessions



We were very pleased to see so many Year 11 pupils accessing the online Saturday Tuition Programme and the half term break Online Intervention Sessions.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff involved and the parents and carers for their ongoing support in encouraging their child to log on.

These Online Tuition Sessions are designed to support your child achieve their target grades in their GCSE examinations 2021. There were several sessions which were focused on Catch-up, revising topics which were taught during the lockdown.

We are currently unable to provide our usual Saturday Year 11 Revision sessions on site because of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has resulted in staff teaching sessions online.

The expectation is that all Year 11 pupils must access these Online Tuition Sessions.

We have issued every pupil at Platanos College with a premium Seneca account. To access this account your child should use their **school username**, followed by **@platanoscollege.com**

The password is **seneca2020**; your child should change their password once they have logged in for the first time.

Keeping safe



There are a number of new procedures and rules which we insist our staff and pupils follow to keep our school community safe:

- 1. Wash hands thoroughly and frequently for a minimum of 20 seconds. We have installed additional hand washing facilities and hand sanitiser stations in various locations throughout the school site. Hand sanitisers are also available in all classrooms. However, we would strongly encourage pupils to bring in their own sanitiser as an additional precautionary measure.
- 2. Minimise contact between individuals, even within bubbles, and maintain social distancing wherever possible. Pupils must be 2 metres away from staff. Pupils should be 1 metre away from another pupil wherever possible.
- 3. Ensure good respiratory hygiene when sneezing or coughing by using the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
- 4. In line with government guidance, face mask must be worn in all communal areas in the school; including when moving around the corridors and stairwells. It is vital that face masks are worn correctly and this requires the cleaning of hands before and after touching them. Please note we have handed

Attendance and Punctuality

Due to our Key Stage 4 pupils missing a substantial amount of learning due to the lockdown at the end of the last academic year, it's important that your child attends school as often as possible and on time.

Despite the later start for Key Stage 4, we still have a minority of pupils who arrives to school late.

Punctuality is highly regarded in any workplace and at Platanos College we try to embed this ethos into our pupils so that they are best prepared for the world beyond school.

In the not too distant future, many of our Key Stage 4 pupils will require references for colleges, sixth-form and apprenticeships. Consequently, punctuality and attendance will be a main factor that will feature within our feedback.

Please ensure you encourage your child to arrive to school on time as this will not only set a positive pattern for the future, but help your child keep up with their school work and maximise their academic achievement.

If your child is absent from school, a notification phone call must be made to the school on the first day of the absence and every further day that they are absent. Upon returning to school, a written note needs to be handed in to the main office, stating the reason for their absence.
