For the last two weeks, pupils have been tasked with designing and writing their own adventure stories, based on the film Jumanji!

#### Maths

#### **Science**

Science lessons were planned to widen the year 6 pupils understanding of science and the role it plays in everyday life. Science lessons were also planned to expose the pupils to the breadth of potential careers that require an appreciation and expertise in science.

Throughout the two-week summer school we focussed on two scientific concepts:

- separating techniques used in forensic science
- chemical reactions

To conclude the pupils understanding of the scientific method, a hands-on practical activity was completed outside. The pupils were very inquisitive when explore the chemical reactions using toothpaste. Pupils made good progress and were able to

recall and explain the concepts covered. Pupils now have a firm understanding of the scientific methods and can plan an investigation to develop a scientific theory.







The attitude to learning and pupil engagement was very impressive. Pupils actively participated in the lessons, they were eager to share their understanding of concepts taught at primary school and how the topics covered in summer school were developing their knowledge base further.
