Platform+ STEM sessions at Westminster School

During the Spring and Summer terms of 2021 a small number of our Year 10 pupils were selected to take part in the prestigious STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) programme run by Westminster College.

The pupils; Reuben, Leisha, Ebuka and Jessica, participated in remote learning sessions on Saturdays across the two terms. These sessions enabled pupils to learn in more depth about the different STEM subjects alongside pupils from schools across London. This allowed for high level discussions and a focus on the more challenging aspects of STEM through engagement with like-minded pupils.

This learning culminated in all four pupils presenting projects based on their learning across the sessions to the session leaders and all participants. The projects included: The history of Chemistry, iPhone science and 'How to

become a champion'. These projects empowered pupils to partake in independent learning, explore their A-Level subject choices and develop their presentation skills.

Pupils were overwhelmingly positive about the programme. This was clear from our evaluation in which pupils agreed that it was both enjoyable and thought provoking. Pupils commented on their experiences below:

"It has given me a detailed understanding of science subjects and I have learnt to better my discussion skills' – Jessica.

"Once we were able to go into the school it gave me an insight into sixth form life and it was fun to meet new people from different places." – Leisha.

"The experience provided me with the opportunity to converse with and learn alongside pupils from other schools which reinforced prior learning." – Reuben.

"I enjoyed the STEM programme as it gave me an insight into deeper areas of different subjects allowing me to develop my understanding of various sciences. I am sure this will be beneficial in the future." - Ebuka

We are very proud of the work that our pupils put into this programme, we received excellent feedback from Westminster College pertaining to both the work ethic and ethos of our pupils. Well done for being excellent representatives of Platanos College.



The Worshipful Company of Fuellers Future Energy Conference

The Worshipful Company of Fuellers held its second Future Energy Conference on Monday 15th November 2021. The conference was attended by many industry and energy experts, as well as Carrie Marsh (Master Fueller) and His Royal Highness Prince Edward, the Earl of Wessex.

As Platanos College is supported by the Fuellers' Charitable Trust, our pupils were invited to expand their understanding of the industry, including how it will progress further, and the importance of the industry on future climate change.



Given that COP26 had concluded just a week before, it was exciting for our pupils to be in attendance where the momentum of future energies in reaching carbon netzero was clear. Many talks, along with

various Q&A sessions, allowed everyone to see how energy may and will need to change in the next decades. Panelists challenged with demanding were questions, including when and how netzero targets can be met, the logistics behind making these targets and on how important it is for countries like our own are needed to support less financially profitable countries in reducing their carbon emissions. A recurring theme was identifying what is necessarv decarbonise various sectors and improve the use of renewable energy.



In addition to the fascinating panels and interesting Q&As, pupils were able to observe elements of the energy industry in action as several presentations were shown as part of a competition amongst young professionals for the conference.

All of our pupils were very much impressed by each presentation, and the ambition, skill and knowledge shown by every panelist as they set out their plans and goals on the journey to net-zero carbon emissions.

We would like to thank the Worshipful Company of the Fuellers for inviting our pupils to this conference. Our pupils were left inspired and hopeful in how industry will change in the coming years.



Anti-Bullying Week



Monday 15th November 2021 marked the start of Anti-Bullying week at Platanos College.

The landscape of career choices is complex and constantly changing. Therefore, it is vital that all our Year 11 pupils have the knowledge and skills they need to make informed choices regarding their career's pathway.


To date, the majority of Year 11 pupils have met with the careers advisor for their one-to-one interviews.

They were given impartial information and guidance to help identify a range of post-16 options, careers advice and useful support networks to help them plan and negotiate their career pathways.

All pupils were also given a copy of their careers action plan and parents and carers were sent a copy by post. We are keen to involve parents and carers in this process and we suggest that you look carefully at the action plan and discuss it with your child.

We will also continue to provide our year 11 pupils with lists of virtual open days for all local Colleges and Sixth Forms.

College References & Applications



As our Year 11 pupils continue to apply to colleges and sixth-forms, please note that references must be directed to ks4pastoral@platanoscollege.com.

While some colleges and sixth-forms schools still offer the option of a paper application, the majority of applications submitted now are completed online. As such, it is imperative that you encourage your child to proofread their online application and check it thoroughly for any mistakes before hitting the submit button. Equally, parents and carers are also encouraged to actively get involved in their child's college application process as this could be particularly daunting for some pupils.

It is worth noting that the level of course your child can apply for will vary depending on your child's predicted grades (which are readily available on your child's most recent academic report.)

Post 16 pathways courses will vary significantly in depth and breadth, with options available to meet the needs of all pupils. Some courses are very practical and skillset based (i.e. vocational courses like BTEC's Apprenticeships, Traineeships etc.), whilst others are more exam based.

Punctuality to school

Disappointedly, we still have a minority of pupils who arrive to school late.

This will significantly impact on Year 11 pupils as punctuality records form part of references passed onto colleges and sixth-forms.

For our Year 10 pupils, this is equally important as they get prepared for their induction into the world of work and work experience.

Please support us in maintaining good punctuality by:-

- Ensuring your child gets enough sleep and gets up promptly for school.
- Ensuring your child has organised their school bag and equipment the night before so that this does not delay departure in the morning.
- Addressing punctuality concerns raised by the school (via punctuality letters) and discussing the importance of punctuality in the workplace and life beyond Platanos College.

E-Learning expectations

As we make increasing use of e-learning resources (Google Classroom, Show My Homework, Seneca Learning and ixl.com) to support our pupils' learning at school and home, we would like to encourage parent and carers to take a proactive role in monitoring their child's online activities.

Please ensure that your child behaves appropriately when accessing any of our Zoom and Goggle Classroom lessons and encourage them to actively access and participate with all scheduled online lessons or interventions.

This is particularly important for our Year 11 pupils as they work towards their GCSE examinations.

Equipment

As we continue to work hard to keep our school community safe as possible from Covid-19, please ensure that your child

continues to attend school with their face covering.

It is vitally important that pupils wear face masks in communal areas around school, unless medically exempt. By doing so, they are protecting themselves, other pupils, members of staff and their families.

Pupils must also remember to bring all their school equipment to school. We will not be lending out equipment, as per public health guidelines.

- A blue/ black pen (with spares)
- A ruler
- A pencil and pencil sharpener
- An eraser
- A Maths scientific calculator
- A dictionary

Uniform

Please ensure that your child has the correct uniform for their return to school:

- This includes hair cuts which should be of a straight forward style

 natural colour without lines or patterns. Lines cut into eyebrows are not allowed.
- Boys are not permitted to wear earrings. Girls are permitted to wear a small stud in the lobe of each ear. <u>No</u> <u>other piercings are permitted.</u>
- Uniform includes: school blazer, school tie in house colours, formal white collar shirt, grey or black trousers (not denim), black or grey skirt for girls, black or grey socks, school shoes (not boots/ canvas shoes/ trainer style shoes).
- Hair colour must be natural

 For girls who wear a hijab this must be only plain dark blue, plain black, plain white or plain grey.

Pupils who return to school in January with breaches of school uniform will be sent home until this is corrected.
