
There is a lot to be gained from becoming a cadet. From fun activities to meeting new people and competing in sporting events.

KEEPING THE SCHOOL INFORMED

LESSONS AND LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

Work to the best of your ability within lessons.

Conduct yourself in a manner that is becoming of a Platanos College pupil (in accordance with the school's code of conduct).

Adhere to all reasonable requests made by any member of staff.

Make a concerted effort to alter or rectify attitude, behaviour and conduct once a warning or demerit has been issued by a teacher or member of staff.

PE NOTICE: ILLNESS AND INJURY

Your child will be required to have **PE kit for all lessons**.

If your child is not fully equipped for lessons, they will be sanctioned with a same day detention for failing to bring PE kit. In circumstances where your child may have a physical injury, they will still be required to bring and wear their PE kit where they will be assigned a role which will not require physical exertion such as an official or coach.

Discretion will always be applied if your child is wearing a cast or requires crutches.

These are learning based trips focused on providing pupils with the opportunity to develop their learning beyond the classroom.

Pupils are invited to attend Trips to Enhance Learning based on their performance in relation to their CHABOP scores over the course of the term. Pupils were made aware of this from the first week of the academic year.

Each child that has been invited to attend the Trips to Enhance Learning will have been provided with a trip letter which contains all the relevant information for your child's specific trip.

The deadline for providing parental consent and payment will be Friday 17th March 2023.

ATTENDANCE

Platanos College can no longer authorize leave of absence during term time, except for exceptional circumstance, which is authorized at the discretion of the Head Teacher.

Therefore, all request for pupils to take an absence of leaving during term time, parents must complete a form 14 days before traveling. If any pupil fails to return to school within the agreed date they at risk of a fine being raised with the local authority.

PUNCTUALITY

The school day starts at 8:40am, pupils are advised to aim to arrive at school for 8:30am to ensure that they have plenty of time to make their way to their designated year group locations. There is a breakfast club running each morning from 7:45am free of charge for all pupils.

When there are public transport strikes pupils will not be marked as late where their journey to school has been affected as this is beyond their control.

On non-strike days, pupils who are marked as late will be issued with a late detention after school for 15minutes.

Please also be aware that pupils arriving after 9am without a legitimate reason and the relevant paperwork to support their lateness will be marked as absent in the registers. The number of

minutes of learning missed will also be recorded. If a child of compulsory school age who is registered at a school fails to attend school regularly and on time, then the parent/carer may be committing an offence under Section 444(1) of the Education Act 1996.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR CLUBS

It was great to see so many Year 9 pupils getting involved with multiple extra-curricular clubs during the Autumn Term. All clubs are now back up and running for the Spring Term with all pupils invited to take part.

There are a wide range of after school clubs available and this is a great way for pupils to learn new skills and make new friends.

To attend pupils must collect a permission slip from the relevant teacher which is to be completed by parents before being returned.

PAIRED READING CLAPHAM LIBRARY TRIP

Under the Paired Reading programme, Year 7 mentees and Year 9 mentors continue to grow from strength to strength in their reading abilities and mentorship. To reward pupils, they are being invited on school trips to visit local libraries. The first two trips took place in February at Clapham Library. Marianna, 7A, shared, ***“I loved the trip and the library was really big inside, the people who worked there were very nice”.***



Pupils attended a tour of the library, a book talk and were given the opportunity to borrow books. Rahma, 7W, said, ***“The trip was very exciting. We got to go round finding books and reading the blurbs.”***



Medina, 9B, explained, ***“The trip was very eye-opening. It was fun to walk around the library, pick out books and read with my friends. The library was really inclusive. There was a ramp for people in wheelchairs and for buggies to use the library easily. There was also an LGBTQ section, a Black History section and a dyslexia section.”***



Ximena, 7W, said, ***“I loved the Teen Reading area that we could go in”***.

“The library has books for everyone and it has a good study area for people to study and prepare for exams”, Simra, 9A, noted.

Ms Raikes, who went on the trip with pupils, commented, ***“It was lovely to see pupils so enthusiastic about taking books out of the library!”***.

Following this hugely positive response from pupils, we are looking forward to more library trips going ahead after Easter.

SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS

Please see the image below containing information regarding the age restrictions for Social Media Platforms, in recent weeks there has been an increase in the number of peer group conflicts that are occurring outside of school hours via a number of different Social Media Platforms. Often the pupils involved should not be accessing the Social Media Platforms due to the age restrictions in place.

The school approach to these types of incidents is to report the matter the school Police Liaison Officer who will then address the individuals involved and their parents. The Police Liaison Officer, will conduct a home visit to discuss this with you and your child.

In the interest of keeping your child safe online I urge you to ensure that you are monitoring their online activity, including ensuring that they are not accessing Social Media Platforms and content for which they fail to meet the minimum age requirement.
