The Spirit of Ramadan: A Celebration of Faith and Culture By Rumaysa Nasser, Year 13.

Ramadan is a sacred month for Muslims around the world, marked by fasting from dawn to sunset. During this time, Muslims refrain from eating and drinking during daylight hours, focusing instead on spiritual growth and self-discipline. Ramadan holds deep significance as it encourages Muslims to strengthen their relationship with God, engage in prayer, and reflect on their actions.



Fasting during Ramadan teaches patience, self-control, and empathy for those who are less fortunate. It is a time of generosity, where acts of kindness and charity are prioritised. Many provide meals to those in need or donate to charitable causes.

A key part of Ramadan is the communal spirit. Families and friends come together to break their fast at sunset with a meal called *lftar*, and they rise early for a pre dawn meal known as *Suhoor*.

These shared meals fosters love and connection within families and the community.

Ramadan is also a time for kindness, and personal growth. The month concludes with a joyous celebration called *Eid al-Fitr*, a festive occasion where Muslims pray, enjoy meals, and exchange gifts to mark the end of the holy month.
